


This week your child was learning about: Superhero's

Literacy

Our book of the week was:

Jackson Saves and Owl by Darren Garwood

The story discussing follows the adventures of Jackson, a young boy with Krabbe disease. In the daytime Jackson cannot move on his own or feed himself. But at nighttime when his parents think he is sleeping, he transforms into a superhero and flies through the town looking to help those in need. We discussed how people may not always be what they seem and we have to look beyond sometimes to find the real person inside.

This week our word is: metamorphosis


This week the children learned that word METAMORPHOSIS is a great change occurs. Like when a caterpillar changes into a butterfly or Jackson becomes a superhero.



Numeracy: Numbers



Number Bonds to 10

This week the children discussed the different way to make 10. 1+9; 2+8; 3+7; 4+6, 5+5. It is important for them to learn these basic combination as they will be able to easily break down larger formulas later in their academic career.

Try the new sounds over the weekend.




Topic: Superhero's

The start of this term we will be focusing on Superhero's, but not the ones we normally see in films and comic books. We will discuss what it takes to be a superhero, how we can find superheroes in unlikely places and how we could be superheroes. We are teaching the children to believe in themselves, their abilities and what makes each of us unique.



How you can help your child at home:
Practice writing as much as you can.

Practice discussing your number bonds to 10. You can use any 10 objects and break them down into the numbers bonds: 1+9; 2+8; 3+7; 4+6, 5+5. You can find any 10 object at home and work combining them to make 10.
