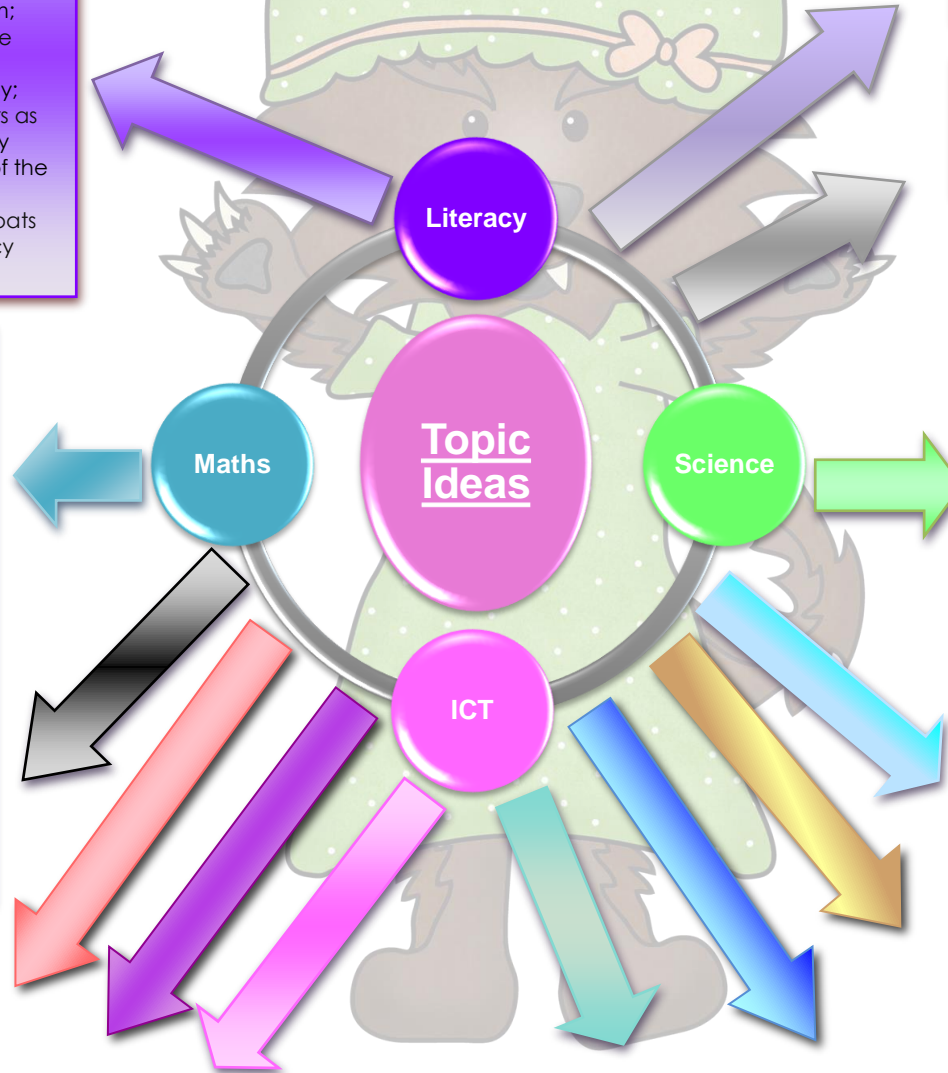


# Year One Topic Plan

#### Number Place Value

Count to 10, forwards and backwards, beginning at 0 or 1, or any given number.

Count, read and write numbers to 10 in numerals and words.

Given a number, identify one more or one less. Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least.

#### Addition and subtraction

Represent and use number bonds and related facts within 10

Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving +, - and =

Add and subtract one digit numbers to 10, including 0  
Solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction using concrete objects and pictorial representations and missing number problems
